

TOPIC SEARCHES AND INDEX

Our lengthy website contains a linkable Table of Contents. However, some visitors have asked for ideas on how to better search for specific topics, e.g. “Disney,” “Buffett,” where our comments may be scattered throughout the website. Some useful suggestions to navigate this website are as follows:

Using Your Browser

1. Internet Explorer --- On the Tool Bar, click “Edit,” then click “Find (on this page),” enter your search topic and repeatedly click “Find Next.”

This method is the most inefficient, but it works.

2. Mozilla Firefox --- On the Tool Bar, click “Edit,” then click “Find on this page.” A box will open at the bottom of your screen. Enter your search topic **and** click “Highlight.” Each mention of your topic will be highlighted. Repeatedly click “Find Next” or use your cursor on the right side bar to do a visual search.

Using Adobe Reader

There are several places on our website where we link to pdf files, which can be read by Adobe Reader. (Free downloads are available at:
<http://www.Adobe.com/products/acrobat/readermain.html>.)

When the pdf appears on your screen, click either the binocular symbol or the Reader’s “Edit” on its Tool Bar and, then, “Search.” A box will open on the right side of your screen. Enter your search topic. Each mention of your topic will be set forth in “Results” with a clickable link. Click on the desired link(s).

We have designated many pdf files with the Bookmarks opened. You may route to a specified topic by clicking on a Bookmark.
